THE JOURNEY OF THE COLLEGE:

Rishi Bankim Chandra College is situated in the adjacent area of East Kanthalpara- the hallowed birthplace of the prominent litterateur and nationalist Rishi Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay. The college began its journey as erstwhile Rishi Bankim Chandra College on 15th January, 1947. From August, 1964, a morning section solely meant for women was started within the same premises. The college was rechristened as Rishi Bankim Chandra College for Women on and from 13th July 1984.

The college was soon to carve its own niche by functioning independently and was included under University Grant Commission 2f and 12b acts in the year 1998. Rishi Bankim Chandra College for Women was NAAC accredited on August 2004. Apart from offering courses in general subjects of the B.A. / B.Sc. stream the college has started programmes in new and career oriented subjects viz- Journalism and Physiology. In recent years the college has extended its infrastructural facilities by constructing a new building to the east of its present campus. With a complete new block as its stronghold, the college is on its way to expand the facilities which might have seen some constraints earlier. Now, it can boast of a better equipped spacious library, more classrooms,

laboratories for new courses like Journalism and Physiology, rooms for National Service Scheme and National Cadet Corps. In addition, the college now owns a two storied building, a day care centre, additional classrooms and laboratories.

Inclusive in its vision, the college has introduced post-graduate courses under Indira Gandhi National Open University. The IGNOU study centre offers PG diploma courses in Translation, and Rural Development, certificate course in Rural Development, and MA courses in English, Political Science, and Sociology. This is with the objective of making higher education available to the maximum number of (both male & female) students and also to provide opportunities to those students who fail to get admission in regular post-graduate programmes. The college also runs an MA(regular) course in Bengali under WBSU.

Rishi Bankim Chandra College for Women successfully runs U.G.C. sponsored career guidance courses for students belonging to SC/ST/OBC and minority communities. Every session sees to the arrangement of such programmes and courses which develop the personality and communicative skills of the students. Career counselling programmes are organized for the outgoing students to help them make better choices in the future. This apart, Teacher-Guardian meetings, grievance redressal cell and similar avenues allow checks and balance in the teaching learning system and other services provided by the college.

A student taking admission in B.A & B.Sc.(Hons / Gen.) has to study the following course designated by West Bengal State University. She has to complete a 140 credit course in 6 semesters of six months within three years or maximum 5 years from registration.

B.A. / **B.Sc.** (Honours):

- 1. <u>Core Course (C)</u>: A candidate has to select one(1) discipline as the core course, eg. Bengali/History/Geography/Chemistry. The candidate has to study 14 core courses/papers for the Honours subject.
- 2. **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) course :** The candidate has to study 4 papers of discipline related courses as offered by the university.
- 3. **Generic Elective (GE) course:** The student has to select two subjects from the given combination for two papers from each subject.
- 4. **Ability enhancement compulsory courses (AECC):** (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English Communication / MIL Communication (MIL stands for Modern Indian Language).
- 5. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) :** The candidate has to study two papers of specific subject related skill enhancement course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE): The candidate has to study two subject related discipline specific courses of two papers each.

Generic Elective (GE): The candidate also has to study two subject related papers for GE.

Ability enhancement compulsory courses (AECC): (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English Communication / MIL Communication (MIL stands for modern Indian Language).

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): The candidate has to study four papers of specific subject related skill enhancement course for skill-based and value-based knowledge.

A. GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All students are accountable to the Principal for their conduct in college. Admission to the college binds a student to observe discipline and all directives that may be issued from time to time by the college authority.
- 2. Class-routine will be given to the students at the beginning of the academic year. Students are advised to be punctual and to attend all classes regularly.
- 3. A student must attend at least 75% of classes for appearing in university examination as per rule of the West Bengal State University. If attendance in any subject falls short of 75% but not below 60%, a candidate shall be considered as NON-COLLEGIATE. A candidate who has attended less than 60% of lectures shall be considered DISCOLLEGIATE and shall not be allowed to appear at the university examination
- 4. In case of absence due to illness or any other unavoidable reasons, students are to submit a medical certificate and a letter from the parents / guardian explaining the reasons for absence, to the Principal. However rule 3 is binding for each student of the college.
- 5. Students must follow the notice board regularly.
- 6. Students are asked to keep their mobile phones off in the class-room and office. They are also asked not to keep their mobile phone in their bag outside the class-room during the examination.
- 7. Students are required to carry with them their identity card bearing pass-port size photograph with seal and signature of the Principal.
- 8. Students must participate in the co-curricular activities of the college.

B. EXAMINATION REGULATIONS AS PER UNIVERSITY NOTIFICATION:

- 1. The Programme of tests for students of first year shall be as under:
- a) The final exam will be conducted in semester format at a period of six months. The first semester will be held in
 - December and second will be held in June. However, the university can shift the dates.
- b) Apart from the semester examination, an internal assessment will be conducted before the final exam. Duration and full marks of tests will be intimated in due course. Participation in the test is mandatory because the marks will
 - be included in university results for GPA (grade point average).
- c) A candidate appearing for the university exam of the B.A. / B.Sc. (Honours and General) courses has to submit such fees prescribed form time to time by the university along with duly filled application form for examination.

A candidate who has admitted herself in a regular course of study has to appear and qualify in both the internal tests and the semester exam. She has to complete the course in 6 semester within five years from the date of admission. She has to complete total 140 credits for honours courses and 120 credits for general courses as designated by the university within this period.

C. INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING EXAMINATIONS

- 1. No student is allowed to absent herself from any examination. If the candidate fails to appear in any college examination on medical grounds, she must submit a medical certificate along with a letter from the parent / guardian explaining the reasons for absence.
 - In such cases they have to appear at the supplementary examination arranged by the college.
- 2. A candidate must sit for the class test and <u>test examinations</u>; <u>otherwise she will not be allowed to appear in the university examinations</u>.
- 3. Students must keep their identity cards and Fee-cards in the examination hall.
- 4. Students must arrive in time. Candidate who is late by more than 15 minutes shall not be admitted to the exam hall. They cannot leave exam hall during the first one hour and last 30 minutes of the exam.
- 5. Exchange of all writing materials, pens, pencils, other instruments etc. is strictly prohibited.
- 6. A candidate is liable to be expelled from the hall, if she a) keeps any book, notes, or scribbling paper; b) speaks to or communicates in any way to another candidate; c) disobeys any instructions of the invigilator or is guilty of rude or disobedient behavior.

- 7. The results of college examinations would be finalized at the meeting of the academic sub-committee.
- 8. The results would be withheld if a candidate defaults in any way.

D. SCHOLARSHIPS, STIPENDS, STUDENT-AID

- 1. The college helps all the eligible students for getting the various govt. scholarships.
- 2. Scholarship is also being provided to the deserving students' from Kanyashree, BIRI WORKER WELFARE FUND etc.
- 3. The Student-Aid Fund / Student Welfare Fund for needy students is distributed from the college fund. Applications should be made to the Principal with the certificate / recommendation of the councilor or member of the panchayet regarding their financial condition.
- 4. Half free-ship will be granted to the students after receiving proper application in time against notification of the Principal / Teacher-in-charge, considering the following criteria: a) results of the previous examinations; b) attendance in classes; c) financial position of guardian.
- 5. Following donations and memorial funds are granted according to various grounds as mentioned against each category.

Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / instrumentation:

The Central Library of the college is fully automated through KOHA: Integrated Library Management Software. The library is spacious with journal display rack and well lighted with filtered drinking water facilities. Presently the library has two adequate reading rooms with CC Camera. It has a stock of more than 15,000 books and various journals on different discipline; e-books and e-journals are also available through N-list membership. Beside this In-house publications of college are also available in institutional repository through D-Space software. On web library site is also liked with different URL address of scholarly communication. Library also provides access of web-OPAC. It has photocopy facility for students as well.

- 1. The college library is open to the teachers and students from 7-30 a.m. to 12-30 p.m. from Monday to Saturday. Library remains closed on 2nd& 4th Saturday of every month.
- 2. No book or periodical may be removed from the library unless the book has been registered at the issuing counter.
- 3. Library is open access to all students and also provides photocopy and Internet services.
- 4. Library cards will be issued to students from the date of admission up to 30th Sept. Students are asked to contact the library immediately after admission.
- 5. Library cards (Bar coded lending cards) are non-transferable. Any library card, if lost, duplicate card may be issued with a fine of Rs. 20/- each.
- 6. Library cards (Reading Room Card & Lending Cards) are non-transferable. Any Library Card, if lost, duplicate card may be issued with a fine of Rs. 10 each.
- 7. Books can be borrowed for a period of 15 days. In case of delay a fine of 50 paisa per day will be charged.
- 8. Talking or eating is forbidden in and around the reading areas.
- 9. Disregard of library rules, indiscipline and misbehavior will render students liable to be refused access to the library.
- 10. Departmental Library facility is also available to the Honours Students as well as some lab. oriented subjects for reference only.
- 11. Book-Bank facility is available to the needy and backward- class students.
- 12. Subject-wise Question-Bank is also available in the library and departments.

G. SEMINAR

- 1. Departments arrange seminars on different important contemporary topics round the year.
- 2. Some UGC sponsored seminars are organised by the seminar sub-committee where expert speakers deliver their valuable lectures before students & teachers.

H. SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

1. AUDIO- VISUAL CLASS CUM SEMINAR ROOM

The college has an audio – visual room at Vidyasagar Bhawan for organizing seminars and audio – visual classes.

2. VIRTUAL CLASS ROOM

There is a virtual classroom on the 3rd floor of Vidyasagar Bhawan, where students can learn their subjects and can interact with other participants through internet. The virtual classroom is a teaching-learning environment where participants can interact, communicate, view their learning resources thorough internet.

3. CONFERENCE ROOM

A well-equipped conference room named Kamalakanta Sabhaghar, located at the main Campus is used by the three colleges for educational and recreational purposes.

4. MEDICAL and HEALTH SERVICES

The Health Centre located in the campus provides limited medical facility including first-aid and primary medication. Its objectives are to arouse health consciousness and to provide medical assistance to students. All admitted students of the college are members of Students' Health Home (H.Q. at Moulali, Calcutta) for advanced medical facilities. Health Camps are also arranged in the college premises or in the neighbourhood in which reputed doctors attend to various health problems of students.

3. COLLEGE CANTEEN

A Canteen for providing students with refreshments is within the college building.

4. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

A Grievance Redressal Cell is there in the college to address the grievances of the students and staff. Two complaint boxes are placed in noticeable places of the college campus.

5. SPORTS AND GAMES COACHING

The college aims to bring about general physical fitness of the students, with a view to generate self-confidence and qualities of leadership and to develop a sense of sportsmanship. Besides, the indoor games facilities are also available in the Girls' Common Room. For the last few years, our students have performed consistently well at the university level and district level competitions.

6. PLAY GROUND

A large college play ground is situated within ten minutes walking distance from the college. It is used for Annual Sports and practice of games.

7. PROJECTION UNIT

The unit provides the use of following equipments:-

8. COMMON ROOM

There is a common room for students with facilities of different indoor games.

9. COMPUTER ASSISTANCE

Library, Cash, Accounts and general office are fully computerized. Students can also avail the internet facility in the Library for searching the books.

10. REPROGRAPHIC FACILITY

This facility is being arranged for development of teaching materials and for official purpose.

3. CAREER COUNSELLING AND EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION

The college maintains a Career Counseling Unit to advise students for their further studies and their better future. Faculty Members are available to students for career counseling. Students are advised for competitive examinations and also provided employment information through suitable journals.

4. CREATIVE WRITING

The college encourages students to express their writing skill through annual college magazine, wall magazine and through other writing competitions. An Annual Journal is published which is enriched by quality writings of students, teachers and eminent personalities.
